Prof Le Grand is a Founding Academician of the Academy of Social Sciences, an Honorary Fellow of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine, and a Trustee of the Kings Fund. In 2006, he was awarded an honorary doctorate by the University of Sussex and in 2007, he was made a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts.

He has acted as Senior Policy Adviser to the UK Prime Minister, adviser to the European Commission, the World Bank, the WHO, the OECD, HM Treasury, the UK Department of Work and Pensions and the BBC.

He has been vice-chairman of a major teaching hospital, a commissioner on the Commission for Health Improvement, and a non-executive director of several health authorities. He has served on many National Health Service working parties, on several think-tank commissions

He is the author, co-author or editor of eighteen books, and has written more than one hundred refereed journal articles and book chapters on economics, philosophy and public policy. His book, *Motivation, Agency and Public Policy: of Knights and Naves, Pawns and Queens* (Oxford University Press, 2006), was described by the *Economist* as 'short, accessible - and profound'.
