Definition Contd

- Drugs working on the brain to cause mood change.

also called - Mood changers

- Recreational drugs
- Addictive drugs
- Drugs of abuse

Drug Use/abuse

Use

- Taking an addictive drug **without any** subsequent development of Physical, social or economic problems. (socially acceptable drugs)

Abuse

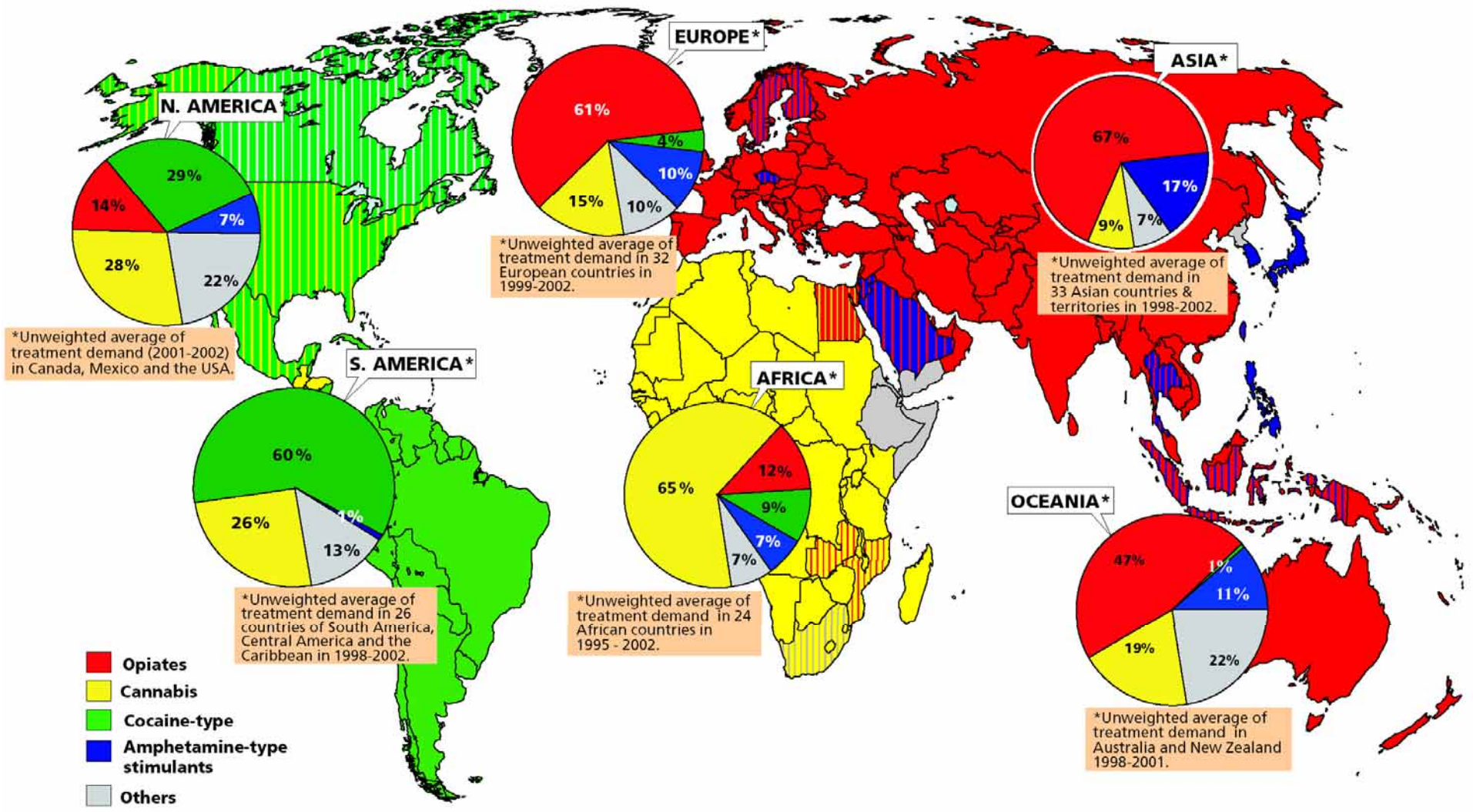
- Taking an addictive drug **with** subsequent development of Physical, social or economic problems.
- Addiction results from abuse

Key issues

- Drug abuse now a public health problem
- UNODC reports increasing abuse Globally
- Trafficking in illicit products is on the increase
- Production of Heroin is seen especially in the Middle East
- Coca Products mainly come from S.America
- Africa – big producer and consumer of Cannabis.

Global estimates.

- UNODC estimates that 180 million people consume illicit drugs
 - 144 million for Cannabis
 - 29 million for Amphetamine Type Stimulants
 - 14 million for cocaine
 - 13.5 million for opiates (9 million on heroin)



WHO

- Global alcohol consumption has increased
- Most increase noted in Developing countries (WHO,2002)
- 1.8 Million deaths (3.2%)
 - cancers
 - accidents
 - homicides
 - Epilepsy
- 4% of DALYs (58.3Mill)

Common drugs of abuse

- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Cannabis
- Khat
- Organic solvents
- Heroin
- cocaine
- Prescription drugs(benzodiazepines, barbitrates, Pethidine, opiate derivatives)

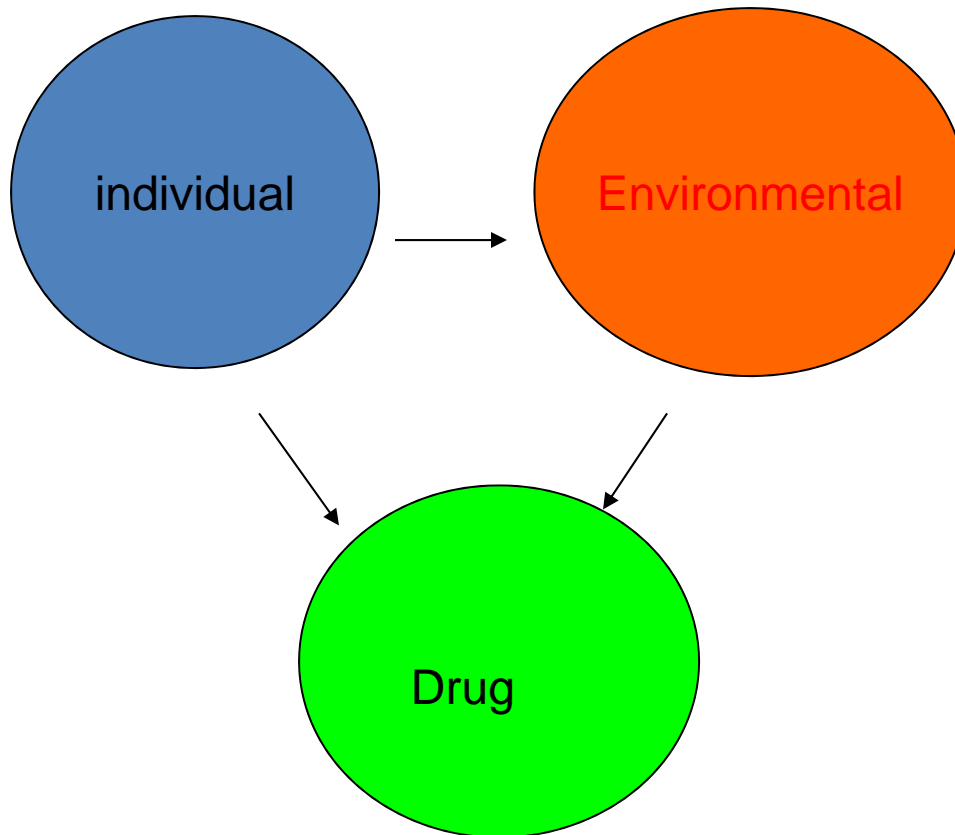

Causes of Drug abuse



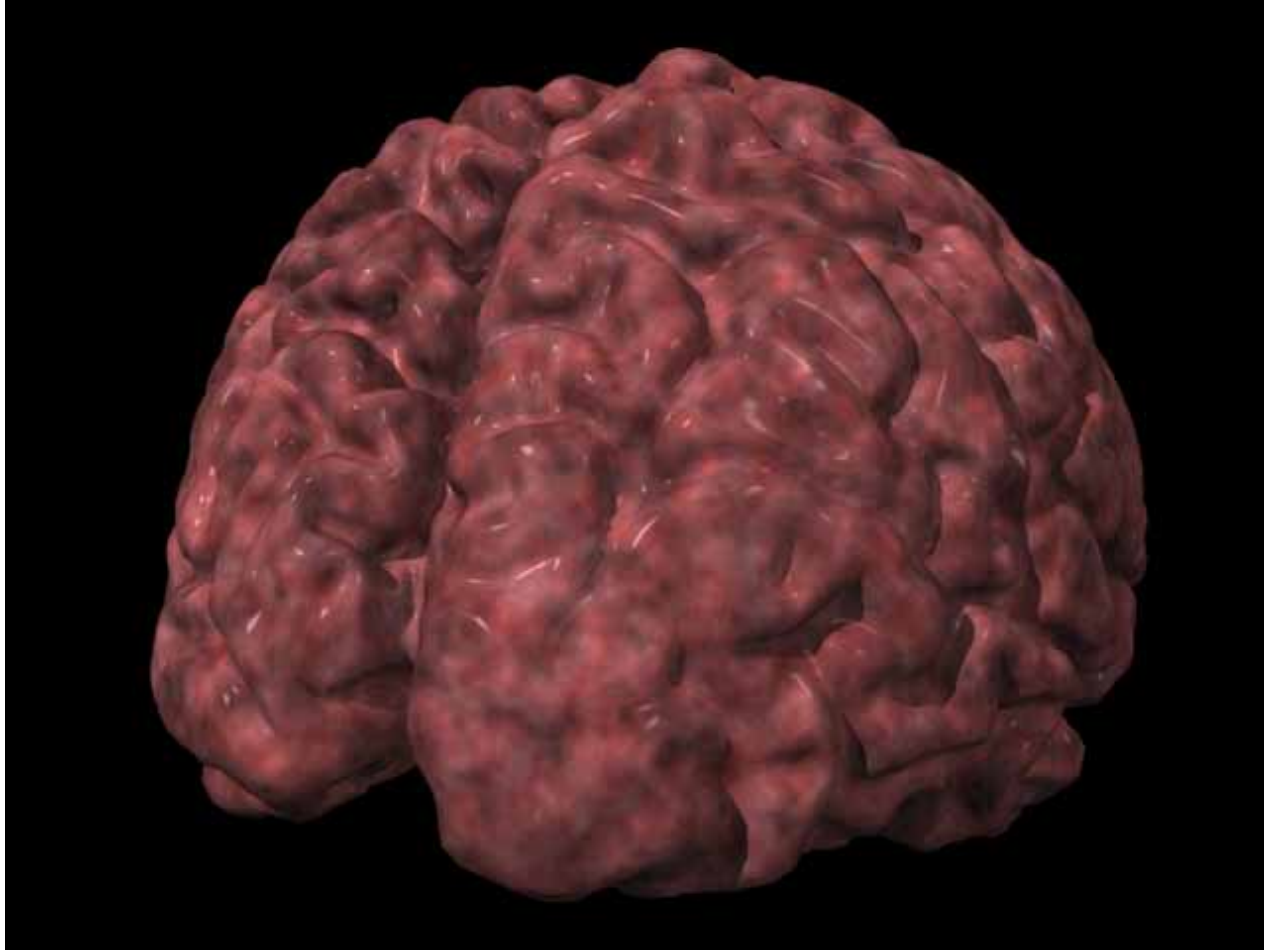
Nature of disease

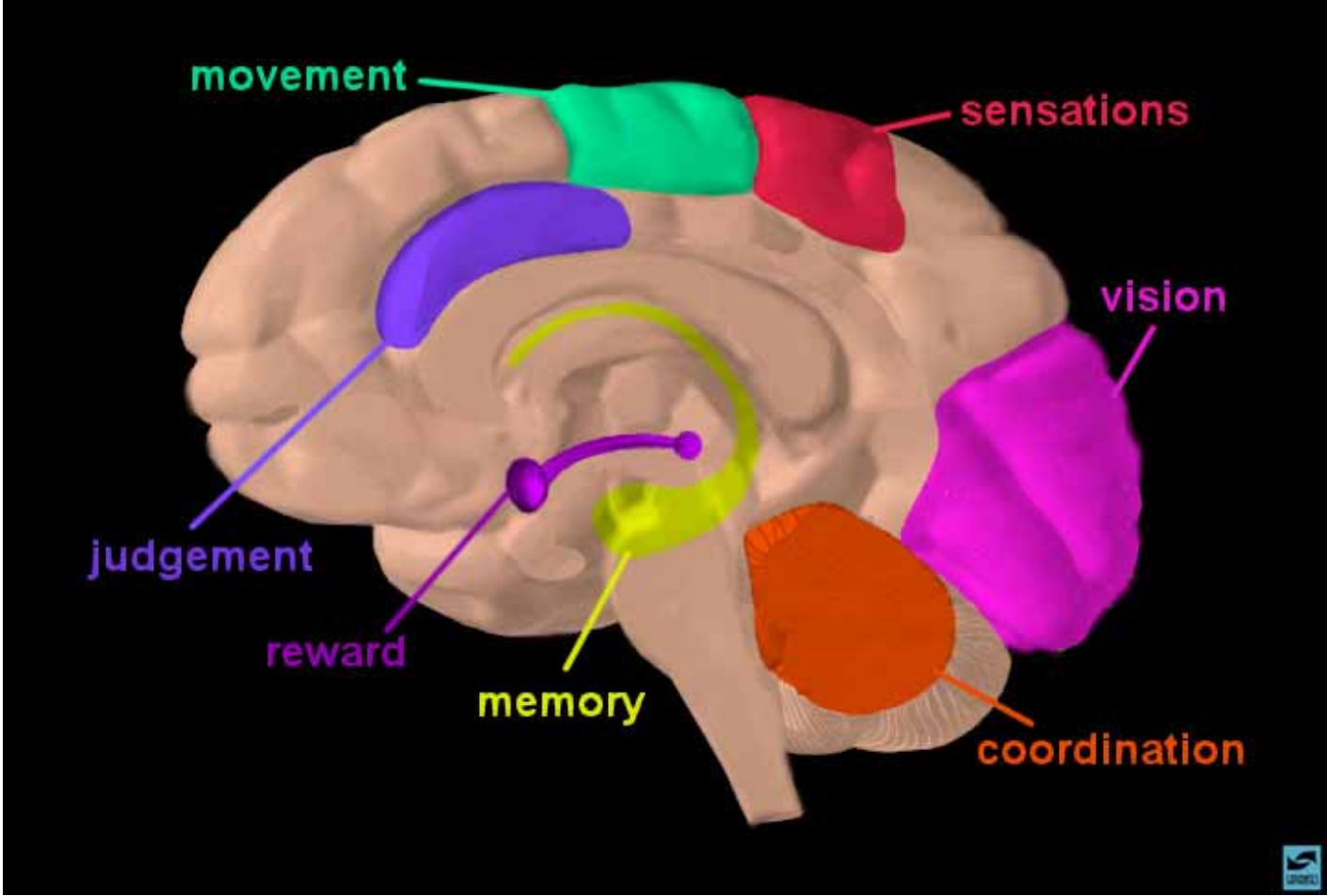
- Drug abuse is a complex brain disease.

Hence: medical model

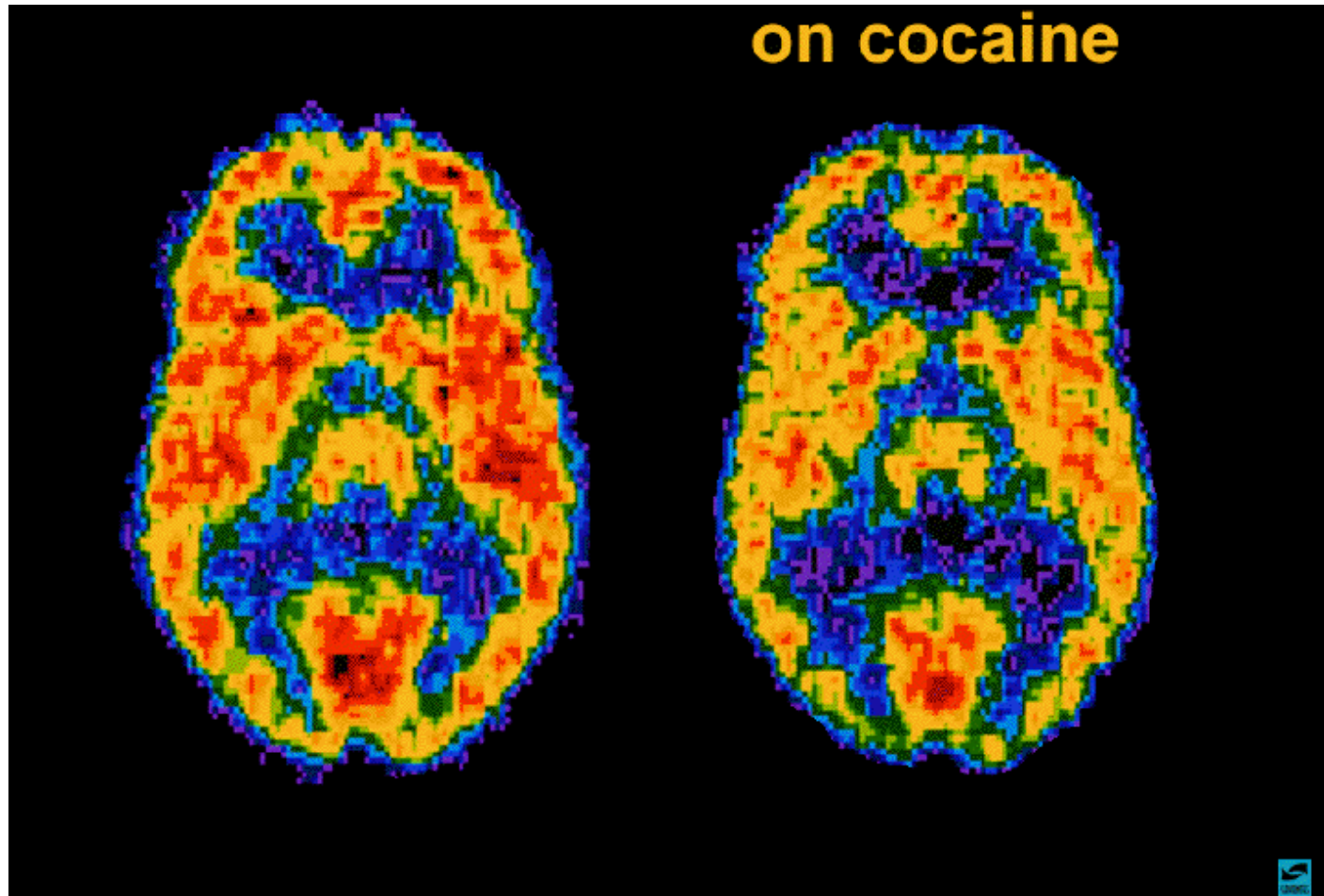
Implication : treatment is possible

- Accountable

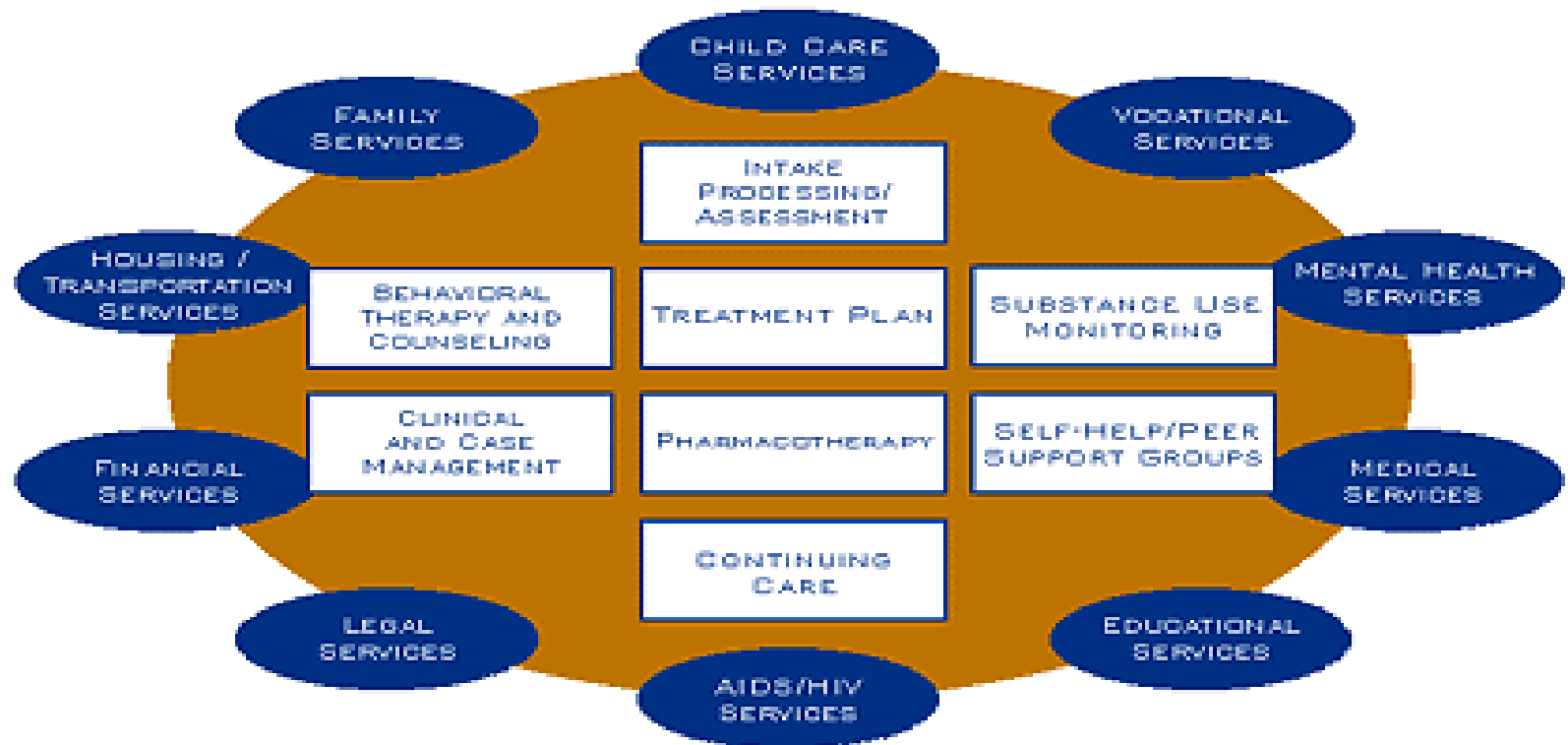
Treatment Cycle

- $Rx = D + RP + AC + SR$

Treatment process/cycle

- Identification/Assessment
- Detoxification
- Relapse prevention
- Social Re-intergration

- Nutritional care

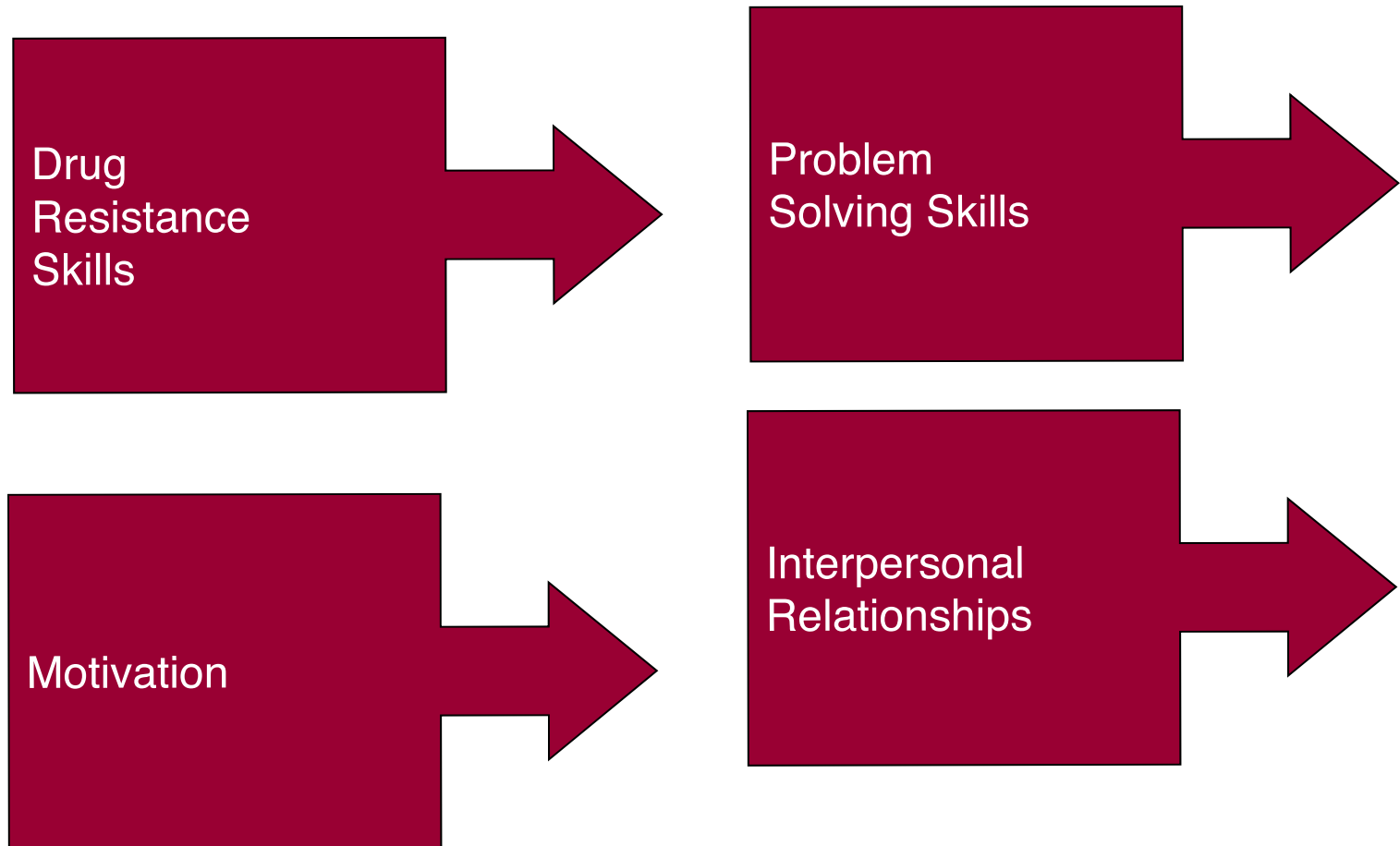
Relapse prevention

- A counseling process .
- Helps one to identify his/ her problem and consciously work on recovery program.
- Uses - general counseling
 - Motivational approaches
 - C B T

Substitution therapy

- Methadone
- Naltrexone
- Nicotine Replacement
 - gum
 - patches
- Anti abuse

Key issues to address



Social reintegration

- Addicts lose skills and jobs.
- Need activities for SL
- Require retraining and skilling for economic independence
- Unite with family
- Unite with society

Follow up

- After care services are required
- Keep them going
- Encourage use of other resources
eg AA, religious leaders, other support
groups.

Monitor for signs of relapse
