The Doctoral School

The Doctoral School (DS) of the University of Mauritius has been operational in 2017 and is responsible to assist in the smooth running of Postgraduate research degree programmes namely, MPhil, MPhil/PhD, PhD and Postdoctoral programmes. It sets guidelines and regulations for research postgraduate education, and implement policies on admissions and academic progress. One of its main function is to process applications from students to read for postgraduate research degrees. Whilst Faculties monitor students' research progress, the Doctoral School provides a conducive ecosystem to accompany students during their doctoral research journey by conducting regular research seminars and workshops, coordinating attendance to research methods modules and other research forums, organising yearly doctoral colloquium thus aiming at building research capacity, providing transferable skills and grooming students to becoming good researchers. The School finally aims to bring the doctoral students together and to create a vibrant doctoral student community.

Research degrees are of different types, MPhil, MPhil/PhD, PhD, and are offered both on a full-time and part-time basis. The University further offers post-doctoral studies.

Students can undertake in-depth research studies in different sectors and areas including Agriculture, Engineering, Science, ICT, Business, Finance, Law, Humanities and Social Sciences among others. The DS and UoM particularly encourage students to embark on research related to the SDGs (https://sdgs.un.org).



The research study conducted will culminate in the form of a thesis which will contribute to knowledge (academic impact) and will have socio-economic impacts.

International Students

The Doctoral School at the University of Mauritius is particularly attentive to prospective and registered international students and provides a range of facilities to such as:

- Assisting queries and providing relevant information on the MPhil/PhD Programme and the Postdoctoral Fellowship offered at the UoM;
- Coordinating students' requests for potential supervisor/s;
- · Guiding students and Postdoctoral Fellows with their research proposal;
- Accompanying all doctoral students through their research journey at the UoM via capacity building workshops, training and short courses (among others).

Postdoctoral Fellowship

Post-doctoral fellows play an important role in academic research teams, both as contributing scientists and as mentors to graduate students. They are also a valuable resource for academia and the Industry. Post-doc is considered as a transition phase from a largely supervisor directed student at doctoral level to an independent researcher. The Post-Doctoral Fellowship (PDF) Scheme provides outstanding scientists with short-term fellowships – of 3 months to 1 year (with the possibility of renewing for an additional year) – at the University of Mauritius. The Scheme is open to national and international researchers who are at an early stage of their postdoctoral research career and who wish to further their research at the University of Mauritius.
