Open Days - 24 to 26 February



Some 6000 HSC school leavers attended the Open Days organised by the University of Mauritius. All Faculties and Centres offering undergraduate and postgraduate courses were present for the event.

Students, often accompanied by their parents, had the opportunity to discuss and interact directly with dedicated academics regarding the wide range of programmes offered



and possible job prospects after the completion of their studies.

They were also closely guided by representatives of the Admissions & Student Records Office on the procedures to follow for online application. In order to assist them in making more relevant choices, they were provided with an overview of their respective programme requirements. Furthermore, the online toolkit which they could consult at leisure with regards to their enrolment at the University was of great assistance.

25 515 hits were recorded on the toolkit and 21 415 applications have been received for the admission exercise for the academic year 2015/2016

Debate on "Constitutional Law: Perspectives from UK and Mauritius"

A public speaking competition on the theme Constitutional Law: Perspectives from UK and Mauritius was organised by the Department of Law, Faculty of Law and Management in collaboration with the University of Central Lancashire (UCLAN) on 4 March 2015.

Twelve LLB students from the UK and eight from the UoM participated in the event. Mr Micheal Doherty and Mr Peter James Kay, both Senior Lecturers at UCLAN Law School, were present.

Our chief guest was Dr Satya Bhooshan Gupt Domah, Former Judge of the Supreme Court. In addition, Dr Domah along with Mr Pramod Bissessur and Mr Micheal Doherty acted as members of the jury.

The purpose of this elocution contest was to provide high-performing



students with an interactive platform, allowing them to express themselves on controversial issues pertaining to Constitutional Law. This was also a unique experience for the British students from UCLAN who were, thus, introduced to the intricacies of our written Constitution and could, subsequently, compare it with their own unwritten legal instrument. Topics ranging from the Separation of Powers, Parliamentary Sovereignty, Constitutional Supremacy, the Best Loser System, Human Rights Protection and Judicial Committee of the Privy Council were the subjects of the debates.

This competition, therefore, proved to be of significant intellectual benefit to our students. Following the deliberations of the members of the jury, prizes and certificates were awarded to participants.

Commemoration of the 20 years of existence of the World Trade Organisation

"The World Trade Organisation, 20 years on: Achievements and Prospects".

n order to mark the 20th anniversary of the creation of the World Trade Organisation, the Department of Law, Faculty of Law and Management in collaboration with the World Trade Organisation Chairs Programme organised a roundtable discussion and a series of presentations on Thursday 19 March 2015.

The discussion of the various panellists centred firstly on the various economic, social and environmental challenges faced by many countries and secondly on the ways in which measures agreed upon during the Bali Meeting in 2013 would help in overcoming these difficulties. Dr Micheal Waibel, from the University of Cambridge, emphasised on the role played by the TRIPS Agreement in international trade while Mrs Mooneeram-Chadee made an overview of the reasons motivating the creation of the WTO.

Other panellists, namely Mr Rajen Narsinghen and Dr Milan Meetarbhan discussed about the status of emerging economies at the WTO and how the dispute mechanism system of this institution is one of the most effective dispute resolution systems that exist.

For his part, the Co-Chair of the World Trade Organisation Chairs



Programme (WCP), Associate Professor Boopen Seetanah, explained the commitment of the University of Mauritius and the WCP to enhance outreach and further research in the field of international trade.

It should be noted that the University of Mauritius has, since 2009, been working in close collaboration with the WTO through the WCP which was awarded to the university following a competitive bidding process.

n 20 December 2013, the 68th session of the United Nations General Assembly proclaimed the Year 2015 as the International Year of Light and Light-based Technologies (IYL 2015). The Year 2015 was chosen because it marks several significant milestones in the field of light and light-based technologies, such as the millennial anniversary of the appearance of the seven-volume treatise on Optics called *Kitab al-Manathir*, by Ibn al-Haytham of Cairo.

In proclaiming an International Year focusing on the topic of light science and its applications, the UN has recognised the importance of raising global awareness about how light-based technologies promote sustainable development and provide solutions to global challenges in energy, education, agriculture and health.

Goals for the year include educating young people about the science behind light-based technologies so as to promote careers in these fields and highlight the importance of research into the fundamental science of light and its applications in order to support the use of lighting technology in sustainable development projects.

Under the leadership of Prof. P. Ramasami, Chairperson of the local organizing committee of the International Year of Light, the University of Mauritius will be organising a series of activities throughout the year. These will include regular talk series by eminent scientists, video and poster presentation competitions for secondary and tertiary students, outreach programmes and a festival of lightworks, among others.

Strategic Plan 2015-2020


n view of the competitive tertiary education environment and to better serve the needs of the country and the global community, the University of Mauritius has developed a Strategic Plan for the period 2015-2020. The University of Mauritius Strategic Plan 2015-2020 was launched officially by the Honourable (Mrs) Leela Devi Dookhun-Luchoomun. Minister of Education and Human Resources, Tertiary Education and Scientific Research in the presence of external and internal stakeholders on Friday 30 January 2015.

The strategies outlined in this plan will shape the future of the University in the next 6 years and will enable the University to be the leading university in the country and a research-led university. The Strategic Plan is envisioned as a guiding document and a reference tool to be used by all staff members of the University in order to work collaboratively towards our common vision for 2020. The overarching strategic directions, objectives and key actions have been cascaded down to each faculty and centre,

which have developed their own operational plan with clear targets, actions, budget and timeline.

Implementation / Execution


n order to drive the implementation process, several committees and working groups have been set up to ensure a proper alignment between the overarching KPIs and those of faculties/centres as well as to look into existing policies and to come up with new policies, as required.

The execution part has been modelled as per the Kaplan-Norton Executive Premium Process. The Execution Premium Process is based on the Kaplan-Norton Strategy Management System[™], a comprehensive management

model designed to address one of management's greatest challenges namely that of linking strategy formulation and planning with operational execution.

A vital part of the implementation of the UoM Strategic Plan is the participation of all staff members and a Strategic Plan Communication Committee has the mandate to communicate the Strategic Plan to all stakeholders.

A series of communication sessions were conducted by the Office of the Vice-Chancellor. The first one was held on 14 January 2015 with all members of Senior Management and Presidents of Union. Members were requested to start working on their respective operational plan with clear key actions, timeline and budget which were to be finalized by the end of March 2015. The Strategic Plan 2015-2020 was also presented to external stakeholders on Friday 30



January 2015. The Communication process continued during the months of February and March 2015 with faculties/centres presenting their operational plan.

The Strategic Policy Committee will review existing policies and come up with new policies which will facilitate the achievement of the objectives set. 6 Sub-Committees namely the Sub-Committee for Teaching and Learning, the Sub- Committee for Research and Innovation, the Sub-Committee for Student Experience, the Sub-Committee for Internationalization, the Sub-Committee for Community Engagement and the Sub-Committee for Financial Sustainability have been set up.

The Strategic Plan Implementation Committee will, in turn, look into the implementation process of the Strategic Plan and will monitor and review progress towards the objectives set.

Monitoring and Review

Strategic Plan

The operational plan of all faculties/centres/unit will be compiled to prepare an overall operational plan of the University with clear targets, actions, timeline and budget. These targets will be used to monitor and review our progress in 6 months' time. Based on the findings, remedial actions will be taken to ensure that we achieve the targets set and reach where we have aspired to be in 2020.

The strategies outlined in this plan will reinforce our position as the leading university of the country and will enhance the international competitiveness of the institution. The level of engagement, dedication and enthusiasm shown by our students, academic staff and members of the UoM community in developing this plan gives us the confidence that together the UoM will achieve its ambitions for the future.
