NOTICE TO STAFF, STUDENTS AND VISITORS PROHIBITION OF SMOKING AND OF CONSUMING ALCOHOLIC DRINKS ON UoM PREMISES

All Staff, Students and Visitors of the University are hereby informed that **smoking and/or consuming alcoholic drinks are strictly prohibited both inside and outside all buildings across all UoM Premises.** Staff, Students and Visitors are strongly advised to strictly abide by this No-Smoking and No-Alcohol Policy.

Strict disciplinary action will be taken against those breaching the No-Smoking and No-Alcohol Policy.

It is also important to note the following provisions of the law and their associated penalties:

- 1. The Public Health (Restrictions on Tobacco Products) Regulations 2023 (GN No. 87 of 2023)
 - No person shall smoke a <u>tobacco product</u> in a public place;
 - A public place refers to all indoor areas and outdoor premises of a pre-primary, primary, secondary or tertiary institution, including any other educational institution, homes for children or any other premises where services to children are provided;
 - "tobacco product" means any product composed, in whole or in part, of tobacco, including tobacco leaves or any extract or any mixture containing tobacco, and it includes:
 - (i) cigarettes, bidis, cigars, cigarillos, little cigars, smokeless tobacco, Roll-Your-Own tobacco, pipe tobacco, waterpipe tobacco, green tobacco, leaf tobacco, heated tobacco products, cigarette papers, tubes or filters; and

- (ii) electronic nicotine delivery systems, electronic non-nicotine delivery systems and other products containing nicotine and devices used for their consumption that may be used manufactured or marketed to replace or imitate tobacco products.
- Any person who contravenes these regulations shall commit an offence and shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine of not less than Rs5,000 and not exceeding Rs10,000 and to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months.
- 2. <u>Public Health (Prohibition on Advertisement, Sponsorship and Restriction on Sale and Consumption in Public Places of Alcoholic Drinks) (Amendment) Regulations 2021</u>
 - "Alcoholic drink" means a drink having an alcoholic strength exceeding 0.5 per cent of alcohol by volume
 - Consumption of alcoholic drinks in public places is prohibited.
 - A public place includes a workplace, health institution, educational institution, sports complex, public fair, public concert and public conveyance
 - A person contravening these regulations are, on conviction, liable to a fine not exceeding 10,000 rupees <u>and</u> to <u>imprisonment</u> for a term not exceeding 12 months.
