I can see in you capable young men and women who can use technology while maintaining a commitment to values and environmental stewardship.

Government wants to offer you exciting prospects both in terms of economic development and personal fulfillment. This is why Education has been at the forefront of our agenda. Quality Education will give you the weight and muscle to reshape our nation's future.

The reform we initiated in 2015 aims at ensuring a more inclusive and equitable quality education. All children are now required to follow at least nine years of basic schooling before moving to post-basic education in their areas of interest.

We are now investing in facilities to cater more efficiently for learners. As from this year, students of Grades 7, 8 and 9 of State and registered private secondary schools are being provided with free textbooks. To make more opportunities available to students who wish to pursue post-secondary training, we have invested in the development of various programmes geared towards the needs of industry. We do not want any child to remain out of the system any more.
